## MHA releases SOPs for evacuation of Indian nationals stranded abroad due to Covid-19 lockdown

- 1. They will travel to India by non-scheduled commercial flights to be arranged by the MoCA and naval ships to be arranged by Department of Military Affairs. Only those crew and staff who test Covid-19 negative will be allowed to operate these flights/ship
- 2. Priority will be given to compelling cases in distress, including migrant workers/labourers who have been laid off, short-term visa holders faced with expiry of visas, persons with medical emergency/pregnant women/elderly, those required to return to India due to death of family member and students
- 3. The cost of travel will be borne by the travellers
- 4. Before boarding, all travellers shall give an undertaking that they would undergo mandatory institutional quarantine for a minimum period of 14 days on arrival in India
- 5. All travellers will also be required to give an undertaking that they are making the journey at their own risk
- 6. While on board the flight/ship, the health protocols will be strictly followed, including wearing of masks, environmental hygiene, respiratory hygiene, hand hygiene, etc.
- 7. All passengers shall be asked to download Aarogya Setu app on their mobile devices
- 8. Passengers arriving through land borders will also have to undergo the same protocols
- 9. The passengers found to be symptomatic during screening shall be immediately taken to a medical facility upon arrival as per health protocol
- 10. The remaining passengers shall be taken to suitable institutional quarantine facilities, to be arranged by the respective states/Union Territories. These facilities may be, as far as possible, in the district headquarters of the district to which the arriving passengers belong
